Possible language structures and expressions:

1. Giving descriptions

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"... leather shoes ..."

"... colourful flowers ..."

"...pretty dress ..."

"...long fringe ..."

"... black pantyhose and ..."

"... large, modern watch ..."
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2. Justifying a point of view

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"I like the first photo the most because ..."

"I'm going to pick the third one because ..."

"Number four is my favourite, even though ..."

"Number three is the best, even if ..."

"The third photo has ... so ..."

"... is so pretty that I just have to choose it."
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3. Expressing certainty

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"... has to be the best!"
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- "... must be the best."
- "... is definitely the one I like the most."
- "... is simply/absolutely the best."
- "... is always going to be my favourite."
- "... probably/possibly has the most ..."
- "... is maybe/perhaps the one with the nicest ..."
