- Presentations could be digitally recorded to increase the accuracy of the assessment.
- If you decide to play a more active role, you could give less confident students verbal instructions for each step of the discussion.
- You and/or the students could add to, or delete from, the bullet point list.
- Note that the possible language structures, expressions, and vocabulary given below are not exhaustive. They are guides to show teachers some of the possible structures, expressions, and words students may choose to use.

Possible language structures and expressions:**1. Giving descriptions**

“I am quite short with curly brown hair.”

“My clothes are casual and comfortable.”

“The market stall is filled with brightly coloured ...”

“I look around carefully.”

2. Making general statements

“Markets are great places to visit.”

“Browsing the market is enjoyable.”

“The market was crowded with people.”

“Everyone likes to find a bargain.”

3. Describing feelings and responses

“I was over the moon!”

“The shopkeeper was annoyed because ...”

“I was absolutely exhausted by the end of the day.”

“I was pretty happy with my choice.”

4. Referring to events

“I started shopping two hours ago.”

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“I am browsing for gifts.”

“After this I will ...”

“In the afternoon, I am going to ...”

Possible vocabulary:

Shops; shopping; market; stall; shopkeeper; stallholder; gifts; presents; prices; bargains; exchange; barter; crowded; busy; noisy; hot; fans; buy; cash; packed; rummage; select; browse; goods; merchandise; stock; tiring; exhausted; break.
