
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# **Individual Presentation**

## Managing the assessments or extending the task

- If you decide to play a more active role, you could give less confident students verbal instructions for each step of the discussion.
- You and/or the students could add to, or delete from, the bullet point list.
- Note that the possible language structures, expressions, and vocabulary given below are not exhaustive. They are guides to show teachers some of the possible structures, expressions, and words students may choose to use.

### Possible language structures and expressions:

#### 1. Giving descriptions

```
"The market was crowded."

"The stalls were colourful."

"The people were choosing carefully."

"It's a great place to visit."

"The stall looked interesting."
```

#### 2. Making general statements

```
"There are lots of things to choose from."

"Looking for presents is fun."

"Shopping is hard work."

"It's a big bargain."

"It's a rip-off."

"The prices were reasonable."
```

#### 3. Describing feelings and responses

```
"I felt so tired ..."

"I enjoyed the fun of bargaining."

"I felt angry because the stall owner was rude."
